Who among us will extend the hand of friendship and peace to these brothers and sisters of ours? What kind of support can we offer?

## We pray :

- for all those who seek shelter and protection as a result of conflict and poverty: may they find a safe dwelling place among us.
- for the peace of Christ to touch all those who mourn and are broken hearted due to family loss or separation.
- that decision makers will act responsibly, compassionately and with justice and that we may all support those countries that welcome refugees.

We remember asylum seekers and refugees who have died, while making perilous journeys to find a place of protection.

Almighty Father, encourage us to reach out the hand of friendship, support and hospitality to those in need, especially at this time of year.

May the Holy Spirit strengthen us in our resolve and efforts to make this world a place of peace, where all will be free to live in harmony with each other.
